**Looking Closer at the Passage**

**14-15** Do you use, or feel comfortable with, different postures of worship (kneeling, raising hands, etc.)? Why or why not?

What is the significance of a name, and why do you think Paul mentions God’s act of giving us a name at this point in this argument?

**16-17a** What kind of strength and power are these verses talking about? How do we know if we are actually experiencing it?

From the perspective of our human responsibility, how do we develop and live out the faith which leads to Christ dwelling in our hearts?

**17b-19** Do we play any role in being rooted and grounded in love, or is it all a work of Jesus?

How is the love of Christ the kind of multi-dimensional reality that Paul describes in these verses?

Does verse 19 mean that we are to become gods, or in what sense do we seek to be “filled up to all the fullness of God?”
