

THE STORY OF REDEMPTION: EXODUS 17:8-16

- 1. Thinking back on this week's sermon, was there anything you heard for the first time or that caught your attention, challenged, or confused you?
- 2. We learned that the animosity between the Israelites and the Amalekites went as far back as Jacob and Esau (read Genesis 25:19-34). Have you ever seen or been a part of sin or animosity that stretched back generations?
- 3. In verse 9 we see Moses' staff again referred to as "the staff of God". Do you think there may be equivalent items in existence today?
- 4. Moses grew weary holding up his hands, and was literally supported by two of those close to him. What does this tell us about Christian community in times of struggle?
- 5. What does this same instance teach us about the need for support in the lives of our spiritual leaders? Is there some way that you can accomplish this?
- 6. If the Israelites won the battle when Moses raised the staff, and lost when his hands came down, did those soldiers who died have free will?
- 7. God deemed the Amalekites worthy of being utterly blotted out. In what way do you find our nation to deserve and/or not deserve the same judgement?
- 8. The Israelites accepted slavery from the Egyptians, ran from the army of Pharaoh, and fought the Amalekites. How do you tend to respond to hostile situations in your own life?
