THE GOSPEL OF JOHN: John 4:28-30, 39-42


- 1. Thinking back on this week's sermon, was there anything you heard for the first time or that caught your attention, challenged, or confused you?
- 2. Why did the woman leave her water pot in verse 28? In what way is this (or is this not) something we should imitate?
- 3. What hope can you offer someone who says something like 'God could never love me'?
- 4. Why might the Samaritans have been especially receptive and/or especially skeptical of this woman's testimony? What lessons can that teach us about our own evangelism?
- 5. Have you found people of a specific cultural or experiential background more or less receptive to the Gospel in your experience? How so?
- 6. List as many things as you can think of that the woman knew about Jesus based on her encounter with Him.
- 7. Why do you think the Samaritans heard and believed Jesus, while the Jews needed to see Him perform miracles?
- 8. Are the details described in this passage sufficient for believers to obtain eternal life? If not, what is missing?






