#### THE GOSPEL OF JOHN: John 4:43-54


- 1. Thinking back on this week's sermon, was there anything you heard for the first time or that caught your attention, challenged, or confused you?

- 6. How much thought do you give to the way you address God when you speak with Him?
- 7. Why might it have been harder for Jesus to testify to those in His home town than it was for the Royal Official to share his belief with his family?
- 8. Can you recall an event in your own life when you knew God's hand was at work? Consider sharing with your group for their encouragement.






