
- 1. Thinking back on this week's sermon, was there anything you heard for the first time or that caught your attention, challenged, or confused you?

- 3. In verse 33 Jesus told His disciples that he was going away, and that where He was going they could not follow. Have you ever left, or been left by, a significant role-model in your life? What impact, good or bad, did this have on your life?
- 4. What is the standard Jesus sets for how His followers are to love one another in verse 34? Use 4 descriptive words or phrases to describe the kind of love Jesus is referring to (bonus points for scriptural citations).
- 5. Using a scale from 1 to 10 (where 1 is terrible and 10 is amazing) how would you rate the following groups of people in their love for one another: Christians as a whole; Valley Bible Church; you personally? How do you think the unbelieving world would rate them? Why?
- 6. What kinds of things are necessary to lead a life of love towards other believers? For example, believers need to be in fellowship with other believers to have the opportunity to love.
- 7. Tell about a time when the love of a believer profoundly impacted your life.
- 8. Is there anything that you need to repent for, or ask forgiveness for, considering what we have learned this week about the command to love?
