- 5. What do Joseph of Arimathea and Nicodemus risk through their actions in verses 38-42? What have you risked for your faith?
- 6. Where do you see Christian's are likely to face increased risk for their faith in the next five years? What should be done in light of that risk?
- 7. How could you use the Gospel of John (vs 35 et al.) to engage with someone who believed that Jesus was simply a good man who died a horrible death?

8. What can you purposefully do this week to be a visible follower of Christ in your family, vocation, or activities?
