| 3. | What effect does gratitude have, both for the person who gives and receives gratitude?   |
| 4. | What percentage of your prayer time would you estimate is spent in thanksgiving for others? Why is that (or is it not) an appropriate amount?  |
| 5. | In what way should (or should not) Christians today expect to be "enriched in Him in all speech and all knowledge" (vs 5), and "not lacking in any gift" (vs 7)?   |
| 6. | Paul reassures the Corinthians that they will be "blameless" (vs 8) before Jesus. What impact does it have to know that as a Christian, despite the mistakes you have made, you too will be blameless before Christ (see also 1 Thess. 3:13 and Hebrews 9:28)? |
| 7. | What changes could you (or do you need to) make in your life in light of the grace you have been given?  |
| 8. | Verse 9 tells us that, "God is faithful". What other character traits accurately describe God? Use Scripture references when possible.   |
