

1. Thinking back on this week's sermon, was there anything you heard for the first time or that caught your attention, challenged, or confused you?
2. Verse 12 warns that even mature believers can fall. Have you seen any leaders of the faith (nationally, locally, or personally) who have fallen into sin? What effect did their fall have on you?
3. As a Christian matures in their faith should they expect to have more or less temptation in their life? Why?
4. Paul doesn't tell us that God will keep temptation from our lives, but that He will provide a way to endure it (v. 13). What benefit is there to having endured temptation?
5. What "ways of escape" (v. 13) are common for God to provide (bonus points for Scripture references)? How can we prepare ourselves to take advantage of them?
6. As we escape temptation in our own lives, how are Christians to act towards others who profess faith, but who seem to tolerate, accept, or promote sin?
7. What role does Christian community, such as Life Groups, have in enduring (v. 13) and fleeing (v. 14)?
8. After Paul speaks of temptation, his conclusion is a command to flee idolatry. How is temptation in general related to idolatry specifically?
9. What lessons did you learn from the sermon or your personal study this week that really hit home for you? What steps are you going to take to apply them?
