- 6. The Apostle John's greatest joy was to "hear of my beloved children walking in the truth." What is your greatest joy? Where do you bear responsibility for this, and what responsibility is God's alone?
- 7. To what degree would you say this year has been defined by joy for you? What could you do this Advent season to more fully rejoice?
- 8. The babe in the manger will go on to endure the cross "for the joy set before Him" (Hebrews 12:2). What was Christ's joy, and how do we share in it?
