- 1. Thinking back on this week's sermon, was there anything you heard for the first time or that caught your attention, challenged, or confused you?
- 2. In this passage, Paul describes the Church as a body. What makes the Church as a body a particularly good metaphor?
- 3. What other metaphors for the Church do you find in Scripture, and what lessons or observations can you draw from them? See verses like Acts 20:28, Jn. 15:5, Eph. 5:23, 2 Cor. 6:18, etc.
- 4. What implications are there in the way that Paul describes believers being part of one body as a fact, rather than as a goal?
- 5. We continue to see Paul's emphasis on unity throughout the passage. Where do you see disunity in the Church today? What about at Valley Bible Church?
- 6. If things like sleep, diet, and exercise are important elements of stewarding our physical bodies, what are some fundamental elements of the stewardship of the Body of Christ as the Church?
- 7. How has God equipped you to serve in an essential way at Valley Bible Church? What about in your Life Group?
- 8. Have you ever felt like your giftings did not fit in the body of your local church? How did this resolve?
- 9. Based on this passage, what do you think Paul would say to someone who said, "It doesn't matter if I don't go to church this week"? What about, "Church won't function without me if I'm not there this week"?
