7. Based on this passage, should we understand the gift of tongues to be an actual spoken language, or spiritual gibberish?
8. What are the three commands in this passage? How are they similar or different?
9. When have you experienced someone saying something that was exactly the right thing at the right time in a way that was uniquely and powerfully edifying? Should we understand such moments as acts of the spiritual gift of prophecy?
10. Based on the way God has gifted you, how can you edify the Church this week?
