Week of May 7, 2023 | 1 Corinthians 14:29-40

- 1. Thinking back on this week's sermon, was there anything you heard for the first time or that caught your attention, challenged, or confused you?
- 2. Paul says that others must pass judgment on those who prophesy (vs 29). Read, too, Galatians 1:8. When someone attributes what they say as having come from the Lord, how can we be certain whether those things should be believed or obeyed?
- 3. How could a believer lovingly and truthfully respond to another believer who has uncontrollably shouted nonsense, which they declare was a gift from the Spirit?
- 4. Would you describe the worship services at Valley Bible as peaceful (vs 33)? Why, or why not?
- 5. Consider this passage (vs 34-35), with others in Scripture (1 Cor. 11:1-16, 1 Tim. 2:8-15, etc.). What role can women participate in during a worship service, and why (teach, speak, give missions reports, sing, give their testimony, etc.)?
- 6. Do the limits God places on the role of women in the church inhibit the growth and edification of the Body? Why, or why not?
- 7. Paul is clear that his instructions are the Lord's command (vs 37). How can we know when those commands are for a specific people at a specific time and when they are for all believers anywhere?
- 8. What unique limits does God put on each gender in this passage? Why are those limits appropriate, and why would it be inappropriate to have the same limits for the opposite gender?
- 9. Describe the last deep theological conversation you had with someone close to you (spouse, family member, mentor, etc.). What did you learn?



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
