- 1. Thinking back on this week's message, was there anything you heard for the first time or that caught your attention, challenged, or confused you?
- 2. The author of Hebrews quotes from Psalm 8:4-6. Who is being spoken about in this psalm (and consequently, in this passage)? Does this psalm have mankind generally in view? Or Christ specifically? Both? Grab a study Bible or commentary and see what you can find!
- 3. If God's original intention was for all of creation to be put into subjection under our feet, why don't we see that happening today?
- 4. We know that Christ's death and resurrection paid the price for our sin, and that we are clothed in his righteousness and can now stand before God. Are there any further implications of Christ's victory that we can draw from this passage in Hebrews? What will our position be when Christ establishes His kingdom? (See Romans 5, 1 Corinthians 6, Revelation 5.)
- 5. How ought the answer to the previous question impact the way we live our lives today?
- 6. Spend some time this week reading and meditating on Hebrews 2, particularly verses 5-15. The magnificence of the Gospel and its implications for our future is spelled out in glorious detail. What stands out to you in particular from these verses? Share your thoughts with your group!
