1. Thinking back on this week's message, was there anything you heard for the first time or that caught your attention, challenged, or confused you?

2. Why was suffering (and not merely death) necessary for Christ to bring us to glory (verse 10)? Find some specific places in Scripture that back up your answer!

3. It is said the best way to learn something is to teach it. Imagine you are explaining the incredible truth contained in verses 11-13 to a five-year-old. How would you do it?

4. Jesus, the Son of God, the Righteous King, the author of our Salvation, is not ashamed to call us brethren (verse 11). Meditate on that truth. How do you think the author intends the experience of our relationship to be affected by this truth? How might a failure to understand this truth distort our experience of knowing Christ?

5. According to verse 14, and 17-18, why did Jesus have to become human? There are at least two reasons highlighted here. Grab a study Bible or commentary if you're not sure!

6. In verse 15, we see that those who follow Christ are free from the "fear of death" that enslaves those who are not in Christ. How should freedom from that fear affect the way we live? The way we parent, work, vote, plan for the future, etc.?

7. Verse 18 mentions Jesus being tempted. The Gospels describe at least a few moments in Christ's life when he was tempted to sin; do you think these were the only times Jesus experienced temptation? What benefit do we gain as a result of Jesus' being tempted without sin?

8. 2 Tim 3:16-17 teaches that all Scripture is useful for training us up in righteousness. We should not walk away from a study of any passage of Scripture without it impacting our lives in some way. What is one thing you are (or will be) applying to your life as a result of studying this passage?
