1. Thinking back on this week's message, was there anything you heard for the first time or that caught your attention, challenged, or confused you?

2. Summarize chapter 2 in your own words – ideally in a single sentence. What is the main point the author is making? Share with your group!

3. The author of Hebrews makes much of Christ being our High Priest. What is the significance of that title? See Hebrews 4:14-15, Hebrews 7:26-27, Hebrews 9:1-15

4. The author of Hebrews opens this chapter by calling us to "consider Jesus" as our faithful high priest. Do so! Take some time this week to stop and reflect on Christ's role as high priest in your own life. How has this truth been manifested in your own walk with God?

5. In verse 5, Moses is said to have been "faithful in all [God's] house as a servant." Is the point of this passage to highlight the importance of Moses' faithfulness? Why or why not? What implications could this have for the way we think about our own faithfulness?

6. In 2 Tim 3:16-17, Paul says that all Scripture is useful for training us up in righteousness. We should not walk away from a study of any passage of Scripture without it impacting our lives in some way. What is one thing you are (or will be) applying to your life as a result of studying this passage?
