- 1. Thinking back on this week's message, was there anything you heard for the first time or that caught your attention, challenged, or confused you?
- 2. As we start Hebrews 6, take a moment to reflect on the previous chapter. Summarize chapter 5 in your own words ideally in a single sentence. What was the author's main point?
- 3. In verse 1, the author exhorts his audience to "press on to maturity." What is meant by the word "maturity" in this context? Grab a study Bible or other resource and see what you can find!
- 4. In verse 1 and in verse 3, is the author calls his audience to maturity as a group to press on toward perfection together. Where else does the Bible discuss the importance of being in fellowship with other believers? Grab a concordance or online resource and make a list!
- 5. Verse 3 clearly indicates that our Christian maturity involves both our effort and God's will. Other passages discuss this dual reality as well see Colossians 1:28-29, Philippians 2:12-13, and others. Given this reality, how can we practically strive for maturity without merely relying on human effort?
- 6. On a scale of 1-4, where 1 is "baby Christian" and 4 is "mature Christian," how would you rate yourself?
 - a. To get an idea of what a "4" might look like, review the indicators of Christian maturity found at the end of chapter 5 and in other places in Scripture (e.g. 1 Timothy 3, Titus 1, Proverbs 31). b. Wherever you are now, what do you think is needed for you to take the next step toward Christian maturity?
- 7. Second Tim. 3:16-17 teaches that all Scripture is useful for training us up in righteousness. We should not walk away from a study of any passage of Scripture without it impacting our lives in some way. What is one thing you are (or will be) applying to your life as a result of studying this passage?
