- 4. Verse 24 calls us to "stimulate" one another to love and good deeds. What ought this to look like? How can we do this without falling into a legalistic or guilt-based approach to good works?
- 5. Verse 25 calls us to not forsake assembling together. Does this mean believers are in sin if they ever miss Sunday worship? Why or why not? Defend your answer with scripture!
- 6. At the end of verse 25, the author mentions "the day drawing near." What does this mean, and why should it motivate us to obey these commands?
- 7. We should not walk away from a study of any passage of Scripture without it impacting our lives in some way. What is one way your thinking and/or actions have changed as a result of studying this passage?
