2. Verse 4 mentions the story of Cain and Abel, found in Genesis 4:1-15. Go back and review the original story in light of its inclusion in Hebrews. What was the key difference between Cain and Abel's sacrifices that made Abel's "better"?

3. Verse 5 mentions the story of Enoch, found in Genesis 5:21-24. Go back and review the original story in light of its inclusion in Hebrews. Most of the names mentioned in chapter 11 are famous and have well known stories. Given how little we know of Enoch's story, why does the author include him on this list?

4. We know that it is possible for those who are not saved (and therefore do not have faith) to do things that God calls good – give generously, love family selflessly, sacrifice for the good of others, etc. And yet verse 6 claims that without faith it is impossible to please God. If a person of faith and a person of no faith do the same good action, why is one pleasing to God and the other not pleasing?
