



LIFE GROUP

STUDY QUESTIONS

Week of Jan. 25, 2026

1. Thinking back on this week's message, was there anything that encouraged, challenged, or confused you? Anything you disagreed with or had never heard before?
2. As we bring our study of 2 Timothy to a close this week, take some time to read back over the book in its entirety. We've covered a lot of ground, and it's worth considering what God has taught you over that time.
 - a. How would you summarize the main point(s) in chapter 4, ideally in a single sentence?
 - b. Write out a 2-3 sentence summary of 2 Timothy as a whole. What is the purpose of this book?
3. As you review our time in 2 Timothy, it is important to consider what God has done in your heart and life as a result of studying and applying his word. What is different in your behavior or thinking as a result of studying 2 Timothy? How have you been encouraged or challenged? What in your life looks more like Jesus now than it did when we started?
4. In verse 19 we see a reference to Prisca and Aquila. This Godly couple shows up a number of times in the New Testament. Grab a study Bible or online resource and do some research on the various places they are mentioned. What do you notice? Why were they so often on Paul's mind?
5. There are many Godly men and women mentioned throughout the New Testament, but Prisca and Aquila are unique in that they are always mentioned together. They had a ministry together that was uniquely a ministry of their marriage, not merely of their individual lives. Can you think of couples like that in your life, at Valley Bible Church or elsewhere? Share with your group!
6. In verse 22, Paul closes his letter to Timothy by saying "The Lord be with your spirit." Why does Paul specifically mention "with your spirit" as opposed to simply "with you"? Back up your answer with scripture!
7. We should not walk away from a study of any passage of Scripture without it impacting our lives in some way. What is one way your thinking and/or actions have changed as a result of studying this passage?

Paul's Imperatives in 2 Timothy

Face Hardship with Courage

Join with me in suffering for the Gospel according to the power of God (1:8)

Be strong in the grace that is in Christ Jesus (2:1)

Suffer hardship with me as a soldier (2:3)

Remember Jesus Christ (2:8)

Realize that difficult times will come (3:1)

Be sober in all things (4:5)

Endure hardship (4:5)

Protect and Proclaim the Truth

Retain the standard of sound words (1:13)

Guard the treasure entrusted to you (1:14)

Consider what I say (2:7)

Be diligent to present yourself approved to God (2:15)

Continue in what you have learned and become convinced of (3:14)

Preach the word (4:2)

Reprove, rebuke, exhort with all patience and instruction (4:2)

Do the work of an evangelist (4:5)

Fulfill your ministry (4:5)

Entrust what you have received to faithful men who can entrust it to others (2:2)

Avoid Sin, Strife, and Speculation

Remind the saints of the Gospel and God's faithfulness, and not to wrangle about words (2:14)

Avoid wordly and empty chatter (2:16)

Abstain from wickedness (2:19)

Flee from youthful lusts (2:22)

Pursue righteousness, faith, love, and peace (2:22)

Refuse foolish and ignorant speculations (2:23)

Avoid those who hold to a form of godliness but deny its power (3:5)

Be on guard against Alexander (4:15)

Greet Prisca, Aquila, and the household of Onesiphorus (4:19)
